The additional supplement to the act relative to licenses, passed at December session, 1824, chapter 148, was read passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

The bill to explain the law with regard to clandestine removals to avoid distress for rent, was read a third time, amend-

ed, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered the following message, which was read.

By the House of Delegates, March 13th, 1827.

Gentlemen of the Senate,

We have received your message proposing to extend the time fixed on by this house, to invite his excellency the goverto sign and seal the engrossed bills, from four, to six o'clock this evening, and coucur therewith.

assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

Also, a resolution providing for the payment of George Shaw, for a copy of Ingersol's digest, furnished the senate, which was read, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

Also, the following message, which was read.

By the House of Delegates, March 18th, 1827.

Gentlemen of the Senate,

We have received your message relative to the hospital, and concur therein, and we have appointed Messrs. Done, Hawkins, and Montgomery, of this house, to join the gentlemen named by the senate, for the purpose named.

Also, a resolution in favour of Benson Coe, of the city of Annapolis, which was read, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

And returned the bill to repeal a part of the act therein mentioned, relating to insolvent debtors in the city of Baltimore, endorsed, 'will pass.'

Mr. Forrest proposed the following resolution, which was read and assented to.

Resolved, that the thanks of the senate are due to Edward Lloyd, Esq as president of the senate, and to William H. Marriott, Esq. as president pro tem. for the able and distinguished manner in which they have presided over the deliberations of this body.
