and from number 234 to number 236, were read, assented to, and sent to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates returned the said bills,

endorsed 'read and assented to.'

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered the engrossed bills from number 80 to number 153, inclusive; from number 167 to number 191, inclusive; from number 201 to 220, inclusive; from number 227 to number 233, inclusive; from number 254 to number 257 to number 252, inclusive, and from number 254 to number 268 inclusive; also, the engressed resolutions from number 1 to number 39, inclusive; and from number 41 to number 88, inclusive; which were severally read, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

His excellency the governor, appearing in the senate chamber.—Ordered, that Messrs. Forrest, and Johnson, wait on the speaker and members of the house of delegates, and inform them that his excellency the governor is now attending in the senate chamber, ready to sign and seal the engrossed bills, and invite their attendance for the purpose of witnessing the same.

Messrs. Forrest, and Johnson, having waited upon the speaker and members of the house of delegates, returned to the senate chamber, and informed the president of the senate

that they had performed the duty assigned them.

Whereupon, the speaker attended by the members of the house of delegates, appeared in the senate chamber, when the engrossed bills, from number 80 to number 268, inclusive, were presented by the speaker of the house of delegates to his excellency the governor, who signed and sealed the same, in the presence of both houses, in accordance with the provisions of the constitution and form of government.

The speaker and members of the house of delegates having

retired from the senate chamber,

The senate adjourned until the 4th Monday of December next.
