

Mr. Heath from the committee made an unfavorable report upon the bill to alter and change the name of the Presbyterian and Lutheran Church of Baltimore County, incorporated by an act, passed at November session, eighteen hundred, chapter fourteen, to that of the German Reformed and Lutheran Church. The said bill was then read the second and by special order the third time, rejected and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Rees presented the petition of Thomas J. Mann, of Kent County, praying that a law may pass, enabling him to convey to a certain David Webb and Mary his wife, certain lands therein described, which was read and referred to the committee on Invalid Deeds.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a resolution, fixing the period for closing the present session of the General Assembly, which was read the first time.

Also, a bill, entitled, a supplement to the act to lay out and open a road from Westminster in Frederick County, to the city of Washington and Georgetown, which was read the first and by special order a second and third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

Also, a bill, entitled, an act to give validity and operation to a deed therein mentioned, which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Invalid Deeds.

Also, a bill, entitled, an act to provide for the payment of Jurors in Dorchester County, which was read the first time.

Also, a bill, entitled, an act to fix the compensation of Judges and Clerks of Elections, in and for Dorchester County, which was read the first time.
