Gentlemen of the Senate,

We propose with the concurrence of your honorable body to appoint a joint committee, consisting of one member of the Senate and two members of the House of Delegates, whose duty it shall be to transmit to the Executive, the accompanying resolution, when the same shall be acted upon by your honorable body.

We have appointed Messrs. Goldsborough and Steuart, of Baltimore City, on the part of this House.

Also, a resolution proposing the appointment of a joint committee of both houses to wait on the Executive and request a report of the progress made by gentlemen appointed to revise, digest and collate the public acts of the General Assembly of this State, which was read the first time.

Also a bill, entitled an act, to confirm and make valid two deeds therein mentioned, which was read the first time.

Mr. Nelson from the committee reported a bill, entitled a further additional supplement to the act entitled, an act for the relief of sundry insolvent debtors, which was read the first time and ordered to be printed.

The Senate then adjourned until to-morrow morning, 10 o'clock,

Friday, January 11th, 1828.

The Senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The report of the Board of Public Works yesterday communicated to the Senate, was sent to the house of delegates.

On-motion by Mr. Dennis, the bill to confirm and make valid two deeds therein mentioned, was referred to the committee on invalid deeds.

The bill to fix the compensation of Judges and Clerks of Elections in and for Dorcester County, was read a second time.
