

Also, a bill entitled, an act to regulate the manner of marketing by slaves and free negroes in Anne Arundel county, and the city of Annapolis, which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Heath, Herbert, and Forrest.

Mr. Dennis, from the committee on Invalid Deeds, made an unfavorable report upon the bill to authorize the recording of a deed from Samuel Cole to Henry Miller, of Cecil county. The said bill was then read a second and third time, by special order, rejected and returned to the house of Delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a resolution in favor of Hannah Sheets, of Frederick county, which was read the first time and referred to the committee on Pensions and revolutionary claims.

Also, a resolution in favor of John Dorgan, of Talbot county, which was read the first time and referred to the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims.

Also, a bill entitled, an act to change the time of holding the November term of the Court of Appeals for the Eastern shore, which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Harrison, Dennis, and Spence.

Also a bill entitled, an act for the relief of Francis Mathews of Cecil County, which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on out pensioners.

Also a bill entitled an act to extend the time now allowed by law to Isaac Hooper, late collector of Calvert county, to complete his collections, which was read the first time.

Also a bill entitled an additional supplement to the act, entitled, an act concerning crimes and punishments, passed December session, eighteen hundred and eighteen, chapter one hundred and fifty seven, which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Sewell, Heath and Forrest.

Mr. Forrest from the committee reported a bill, antitled an additional supplement to the act entitled, an act concerning crimes and punishments, passed at November session, one thousand eight hundred and nine, which was read the first time and ordered to be printed.

The clerk of the House of Delegates delivered a bill entitled, an act to anthorise Joshua W. Massey of Queen Ann's county, to convey the land therein mentioned, which was read the first time and refered to Messrs. Harrison, Dennis, and Sewell.

The senate then proceeded to the consideration of the order of the day, being the bill entitled, a supplement to an act, entitled an act against excessive usury; when on motion of Mr
