The clerk of the House of Delegates delivered the following message, which was read.

By the House of Delegates, January 17th, 1828.

Gentlemen of the Senate,

We propose with the concurrence of your honorable body to appoint a joint committee, consisting of three members of the house of delegates, and ——— members of the Senate, to carry into effect the object of the resolution, relating to the State Library, and herewith accompanied resolution. We have appointed Messrs. Goldsborough, McMahon and Hawkins, the committee on the part of this house.

Also, a resolution, respecting the claims of the surviving officers and soldiers of the revolution, which was read the first time.

Also, a resolution, in favor of Mary Sears, of Harford County, which was read the first time, and referred to the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims.

Also, a bill, entitled, a supplement to the act, entitled, an act to incorporate a Presbyterian and Lutheran Church, in the county of Baltimore, passed November session, 1800 chapter 14, which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Heath, Kennedy and Whiteley.
