There is no prospect of ever recovering any part of this claim from the principal. The agent believes part will be recovered from securities or their representatives. Suits are now pending against them.

George Dashiell and securities

Proceedings in this case were suspended by the legislature till the 1st January, 1827. The agent has since that time collected 860 dollars and executions are now in the sheriffs hands. For such part of this balance as became due the state for G. Dashiell's third year's sheriffalty the proceedings are suspended by an injunction bottomed on the insufficiency of the bond.

Francis Gillespie and securities

Gillespie is dead, and his estate is insolvent. Executions are now in the sheriff's hands against the securities, who were indulged at the last court, under a promise from some of them, that the money should be paid by the 1st Nov. last, the agent thinks the debt secure, and expects it will be paid into the treasury by the next court

John S. Blake and securities

No part of this money has yet been recovered. There has been judgment against the principal from whom there is no prospect of recovering any thing. Suits are now pending against representatives of some of the securities, and from them a part of this debt will be recovered, agent thinks, in the course of this year.
