Determined in the affirmative, and the bill was returned to the house of delegates

The clerk of the house of delegates returned the bill to incorporate the Neptune Insurance Company, endorsed will pass, with the proposed amendment, amendments proposed, viz: 1st strike out "first," and insert "second," in the 7th line of the 3d section. 2d. At the end of the 6th section add "at which sum the said capital shall be limited." 3d. At the end of the 12th section, add "no longer," which amendments were read and laid on the table.

The bill to authorise the building of a bridge across the south branch of the Patapsco river from a point on the lands of Richard Cromwell, to a point on the opposite shore on the land of William Krebs, was read a third time by special order passed and returned to the house of delegates.

The bill authorising the recording of a deed from Daniel Schnebly, late sheriff of Washington county to Emanuel Newcomer, was read a second time.

Mr. Kennedy offered the following preamble as an amendment to the bill viz: Whereas it appears from the petition of Isaac S. White of Washington county, that in consequence of the neglect or omission to have a deed for a tract of land in said county recorded within the time limited by law from Daniel Schnebly late sheriff of Washington county to Emanuel Newcomer, a part of which land has been purchased by the said Isaac S. White, and has again been sold by him at a considerable sacrifice in order to meet the payment of a judgment on a bond in which he was security and upon which execution has been issued and is now in the hands of the sheriff, and the purchaser of the land from said White refuses to make payment, until a good and sufficient title is made—and although there may be redress in law or equity in this case, yet there is not time to obtain redress before the next Washington county court, and the petitioners personal property will therefore be sacrificed, and as the said White's case is one of peculiar emergency and requires the immediate interposition of the Legislature therefore.
