Also, a bill entitled a further additional supplement to the act concerning crimes and punishments, which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Heath, Herbert and Thomas.

Also, a bill entitled, an act for the benefit of James Galbraith of Cecil county, which was read the first time and referred to the committee on divorces.

The bill to provide for the valuation and condemnation of water at the mouth of Windsor's creek, in Somerset county for the erection and establishment of a tide mill; was read a third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Thomas from the committee to whom was recommended the bill to extend the time now allowed by law to Isaac Hooper, late collector of Calvert county to complete his collections, made an unfavorable report upon the same. The said bill was then read, rejected and returned to the house of delegates.

The bill for the preservation of the navigation of the rivers Transquakin and Chicknamacomico in Dorchester county; was read the second and by special order the third time and will pass.

The Senate adjourned until to-morrow morning 10 o'clock.
