

4th. In the 7th line of the same section, strike out the word "representatives," and insert in lieu thereof, the words "heirs and assigns."

5th. Strike out the 2nd section, and insert in lieu thereof the following, "And be it enacted, that upon the payment of the said damages or a tender thereof, to Levin Woodall, and the guardian of the children of William Anderson respectively, the said Jesse Roluson and his heirs and assigns, shall have free ingress and egress to and from the said ditch, for the purpose of cleansing the same farm thereafter."

6th. Insert the following section at the end of the bill. And be it enacted, that of the land of the said Levin Woodall, and the children of said William Anderson shall be overflowed by water passing from the land of said Jesse Roluson, the said Levin Woodall and the children of the said William Anderson respectively, and all or any persons claiming said land under the said Levin or the said children of said Anderson, are hereby respectively authorised and empowered to institute a special action on the case in the county court of Queen Ann's, against the said Jesse, or against any person or persons to whom said farm of said Jesse may belong at the time of such overflow, to recover such damages as a jury shall find them entitled to for the injury by them respectively, sustained by reason of such inundation.

Which amendments were read and assented to. The bill was then read a second time as amended, and on motion of Mr. Lloyd, ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Whiteley from the committee to whom was recommended the bill to regulate the accounts of the county charges for Dorchester county, reported the same, with the following amendments, viz:

Amendments proposed. 1st Strike out the 1st and 2nd sections of the bill. 2nd. Strike out all of the 8th section after the word "enacted," and insert in lieu thereof the following: "By the general assembly of Maryland, that if any accounts or debts shall or may be returned insolvent by the collector of Dorchester county, by reason of the debtors having no property, real, personal or mixed out of which the same may be collected, and if the levy court of said county should be dissatisfied with said return, it shall be lawful for said court to cause the said debts or accounts to be set up and sold at public sale to the highest
