

4th. In the 12th line of the 5th section, after the word 'composed,' insert 'which bond shall be recorded in the clerk's office of the county court of said county, and a copy thereof under the seal of said court shall be as sufficient evidence as the original would be if produced as proved;' strike out the words "in their opinion," in the 4th line of the 7th section, and insert the word "direct."

Which amendments were read and assented to. The said bill was then read a second and by special order a third time and passed.

Mr. Heath from the committee made a favorable report upon the bill entitled an additional supplement to the act relating to the city of Baltimore. The said bill was then read a second, and by special order a third time, and passed.

Mr. Forrest from the committee reported a bill entitled, an act to empower the judges of Montgomery county court to direct the sale of the lands therein mentioned, which was read the first, and by special order a second time, and on motion of Mr. Whiteley, ordered to lie on the table.

The Senate adjourned until to-morrow morning ten o'clock.

Tuesday, 19th February, 1828.

The Senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. Mr. Thomas appeared in the senate.

The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The additional supplement to an act entitled, an act relating to the city of Baltimore, and the bill to provide for electing commissioners for Harford county, and prescribing their powers and duties, were returned to the house of delegates.

The amendment proposed by Mr. Kennedy on yesterday to the bill to incorporate the Westminster savings institution, was assented to. The bill was then read a second time, and laid on the table.

Mr. Johnson presented the petition of many residents and property holders affected by the law of the last session prohibiting swine from going at large within a certain distance from the city of Baltimore, praying that such law may not be repealed, which was read and referred to Messrs Heath, Lloyd and Nelson.
