

In the 6th line of the 4th section strike out the word 'eighteen' and insert the words "ten dollars for a license to keep a victualing house or to keep a cook shop or an oyster house, and eighteen dollars for every other license required by this section," which was read and the same question was put on this as on the former amendment, and determined in the affirmative.

On motion of Mr. Kennedy the question was put, 'will the senate adjourn?' determined in the negative.

The senate again proceeded with the consideration of the message relating to the bill entitled, an act to regulate the issuing of licenses to traders, keepers of ordinaries and others.

Mr. Kennedy offered the following as an amendment to wit, strike out the 8th section of the bill, which was read and the same question was put on this as on the former amendments, and it was determined in the negative.

Mr. Heath offered the following as an amendment to wit, strike out the word 'twelve' in the 14th line of the second section, and insert the word 'ten,' which was read, and the same question was put, on this as on the same amendments, and it was determined in the affirmative.

Mr. Forrest offered the following as an amendment to wit, strike out the proviso proposed in the message as the 3d amendment and insert in lieu thereof, the following, to wit, 'provided that any license to vend said articles, may be granted by said clerks to extend to the second day of May next, for which the person receiving the same shall pay for the use of the State, a sum proportionate to that charged for a license under the existing laws for a whole year, regarding the time for which it shall issue, which was read, and the same question was put on this as on the former amendments, and determined in the affirmative.

Mr. Forrest also offered the following as an amendment to the message to wit, 'strike out the 4th amendment as proposed in the message, which amendment was in these words to wit: I the 4th line of the 3d section; after the word 'manner' strike out all that follows of that section, and insert the words 'now provided by law,' and the following proviso.

'Provided nevertheless, That if the grand jury of any county court, or of the city court of Baltimore shall signify to the county court or city court of Baltimore, (as the case may be) their opinion that a license ought not to be granted to any individual or individuals, named in the lists to be laid before them, under the provisions of this act, that the clerks of said courts shall not be authorised to grant a license or licenses to any such individual or in-
