On motion of Mr. Johnson, the following amendment was read and assented to, to wit; After the word ‘liquors’ insert the words ‘or groceries of any kind,’ in the amendment proposed on yesterday by Mr. Kennedy to the message, which amendment is in these words, to wit; In the 4th and 5th lines of the 2nd section strike out ‘12 dollars’ and insert ‘10 dollars for a license to retail wine or spirituous liquors, 10 dollars for a license to retail dry goods, 20 dollars for a license to sell goods or articles of any kind by wholesale or by wholesale and retail.’

On motion of Mr. Herbert, the Senate reconsidered the above written amendment. After much discussion in relation to question of order. On motion the following question was put—“will the Senate strike out “12 dollars” in the 4th and 5th lines of the 2nd section, and insert the words “10 dollars for a license to retail spirituous liquors 10 dollars for a license to retail dry goods, 20 dollars for a license to sell goods or articles of any kind by wholesale or by wholesale and retail.” The yeas and nays being asked for, were taken and appeared as follows.

On motion of Mr. Heath the question was put, “will the the Senate reconsider the vote they passed on the amendment proposed by Mr. Heath on yesterday”—which amendment was in these words, to wit:—strike out the word “twelve” in the 14th line of the 2d section and insert the word “ten.” It was determined in the affirmative.

The question was then put, is it the pleasure of the Senate to strike out the word “twelve” and insert the word “ten.” Determined in the negative.
