Also, a bill entitled, an act to facilitate the collection of taxes due upon lands in Prince Georges county, belonging to non resident proprietors, which was read the first time.

Mr. Forrest offered the following message, which was read and assented to.

By the Senate, February 23, 1828.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,

We have received your message of this day, proposing a joint committee to confer upon the propriety of making provision for the institution of the deaf and dumb of this state. We unite with you cordially in so benevolent a work, and with that view have appointed Messrs. Forrest, Thomas, Johnson, Heath and Harrison as the committee on the part of the senate.

The Senate adjourned until Monday morning ten o'clock,

Monday February 25th, 1828.

The senate met. Present the same members as on Saturday.

The proceedings of Saturday were read.

The bill for the relief of Gabriel Isaacs an insolvent debtor of the city of Baltimore, passed the senate on Saturday last, was returned to the house of delegates.

The message offered on Saturday last by Mr. Forrest and assented to by the senate appointing a joint committee to enquire into the expediency of making provision for the instruction of the deaf and dumb of this State, was sent to the house of delegates.

On motion of Mr. Harrison the senate proceeded to the consideration of the bill to secure to Henry Hindman of Queen Ann's county, an annuity in the real estate therein mentioned, the question before the senate being on the engrossment of the bill, and the question was put, shall the bill be engrossed for a third reading. Determined in the affirmative.

Mr. Kennedy from the committee reported a bill entitled, an act for the relief of Eli Bench of Washington county, which was read the first time.
