

port upon the resolution in favor of Washington Hall of Cecil county; the resolution was then read a second time.

The bill for the relief of Eli Rench of Washington county, was read a second time by special order, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading. The same having been engrossed was read a third time by special order, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Whiteley from the committee to whom was referred the bill to authorise the levy court of Caroline county to make sale of a part of the public land in the village of Denton, in Caroline county, reported the same with the following amendment, to wit.

Add the following as an additional section. "And be it enacted, that if at any time hereafter, those who originally owned the land, on which said front street was situated at the time said highway was condemned, or their heirs or assigns, shall deem themselves aggrieved by any provision in this act, they or either of them, may apply to the levy court of Caroline county, to appoint three commissioners to appaise such damages, and said commissioners shall return such assessment to the levy court of Caroline county, and the said valuation shall be assessed and levied and collected, as other county charges are, and paid over to such owners or their heirs or assigns."

Which amendment was read and assented to. The said bill was then read as amended, a second and by special order a third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

On motion of Mr. Dennis, the senate proceeded to the third reading of the bill to authorise George Parker, senior, to remove a negro boy from the state of Delaware to this state.

On proceeding in the third reading, Mr. Dennis offered the following amendment, to wit: Amendment proposed, Strike out all the bill after the word 'Isaac,' in the 4th line of the 1st section and insert in lieu thereof, the following, viz: 'And dispose of said negro without incurring the penalties of the laws now existing.' The same having been read was assented to.

The bill having been read throughout as amended, was passed.

The Senate adjourned until to-morrow morning ten o'clock.
