Mr. Whiteley offered the following message.

By the Senate, February 26th 1828.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates.

We propose with the concurrence of your honorable body to adjourn the present session of the Legislature on Saturday the 8th of March next.

Mr. Forrest moved to adjourn, and the question was put, and determined in the affirmative.

So the senate adjourned until to-morrow morning 10 o'clock.

Wednesday February 27th, 1828.

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday.

The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill for the encouragement of primary schools in Anne Arundel county, was read a third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

The bill to incorporate the Tla-co-tal mining company was read a second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Mr. Whiteley from the committee made a favourable report upon the bill relating to the public roads in Talbot county, which was read a second and by special order a third time, amended and passed.

On motion of Mr. Whiteley the president named Mr. Johnson to supply the vacancy existing in the committee on engrossed bills, occasioned by the absence of Mr. Harrison.

Mr. Heath presented the petition of David Winchester and others praying the passage of a law authorising and directing the commissioners of Baltimore county to levy a sum of money for the purposes therein mentioned.

On motion of Mr. Whiteley the senate proceeded to give a first, and by special order a second reading to the message yesterday offered by Mr. Whiteley in these words to wit:

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates.
