

Also, a bill entitled, an act to facilitate the collection of taxes levied on the lands of non-residents in Calvert county, which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Kennedy, Whiteley and Herbert.

Mr. Heath offered the following resolution which was read the first time, and laid on the table:

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Librarian be, and he is hereby under the direction of the Library committee to collect and cause to be bound and deposited in the State Library six copies of the Reports and public documents, submitted to the Legislature, or either branch thereof, during each session, commencing with the present session. And that so many copies not exceeding six copies of the reports and document of each of the past sessions as can be procured, shall in like manner be collected by him bound and deposited in the library.

The resolution in favor of Washington Hall of Cecil county, was read a third time, and after considerable discussion, on motion of Mr. Kennedy, the resolution was ordered to lie on the table.

The Senate adjourned until to-morrow morninging 10 o'clock.

Thursday, February 28, 1828.

The Senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

Mr. Sewell offered the following message, which was read, assented to, and sent to the house of delegates.

By the House of Delegates, February 27, 1828.

Gentlemen of the Senate,

We agree to the proposition contained in your message
