

and by special order a third time, rejected and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Johnson from the committee, reported a bill entitled, an act for the benefit of the proprietors of certain lots on Jones' Falls, in the city of Baltimore, which was read the first time.

On motion of Mr. Kennedy, the following order was read and adopted:

Ordered, that the Governor and Council be requested to communicate to the senate any information they may be in possession of relative to the settlement of the dividing line and boundary between this state and the commonwealth of Virginia, and whether the legislature of Virginia have agreed to appoint commissioners on their part, as provided to be done by the state of Maryland, under the resolution passed at December session, 1825, No. 82.

Mr. Sewell from the committee, made a favorable report upon the bill authorising the orphans court of Cecil county to appoint a guardian to sell and convey the property of Allin Wilson, which was read the second time.

Mr. Dennis asked and obtained leave to bring in a bill to be entitled, an act concerning defects in sheriff's bonds. The president named Messrs. Dennis, Lloyd and Rees as a committee to prepare and report the same.

On motion of Mr. Johnson, the senate gave a third reading to the engrossed bill, to incorporate the stockholders of the Hal-co-tal Mining company, and the question was put and determined in the affirmative, and it was sent to the house of delegates.

On motion of Mr. Johnson the bill for the benefit of the proprietors of certain lots on Jones' Falls, in the city of Baltimore, was read a second time, by special order, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading; and having been engrossed, was read a third time by special order, was passed and sent to the house of delegates.

Mr. Kennedy from the committee to whom was referred the bill to establish a bank and incorporate a company, under the name of the Washington county bank, in Washington county, reported the same without amendment. The said bill was then read a second time.

On motion of Mr. Dennis, the bill authorising the orphans court of Cecil county to appoint a guardian to sell and convey the land of Allen Wilson, was read a third time by special order.
