Determined in the affirmative, and the bill was returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Thomas from the committee to whom was referred the preamble and resolution relative to the State's claim against the government of the United States, reported the same with the following amendment, to wit.

In the 11th line of the preamble, after the word 'sufficient' strike out all that follows of the preamble, and insert in lieu thereof, the following, 'by the proper officer to warrant an adjustment upon principles which we deem just and equitable.' Which amendment was read and assented to. The resolution as amended, was then read a second time.

Mr. Heath from the committee made an unfavorable report upon the bill to incorporate a company for the establishment of a literary, scientific and military academy, in Baltimore county. The said bill was then read a second and by special order a third time, rejected and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Heath from the committee made a favourable report upon a supplement to the act to open and extend Pine street in the city of Baltimore. The said bill was then read a second, and by special order a third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Heath from the committee made an unfavourable report upon the bill to appoint a trustee to sell certain real estate therein mentioned. The said bill was then read a second, and by special order a third time, rejected and returned to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a resolution relative to the transmission of an authenticated copy of the act relative to the inspection of Tobacco to each of the inspectors of this State, which was read the first and by special order a second and third time, and assented to.
