

Sprigg and Joseph A. Johnson administrator of John Sprigg with the documents accompanying the same, heretofore presented to the senate by him.

On motion of Mr. Dennis, the senate reconsidered the bill to authorise and empower Frisby Henderson, James Sewell and Enoch Cloud, of Cecil county, to sell and convey the property therein mentioned. The said bill was then read the first, and by special order the second and third time, when Mr. Dennis moved to amend the same by adding the following at the end of the bill, to wit;

“Provided that nothing herein contained shall effect the rights of any creditor who shall prior to the distribution of the proceeds of said sale, file a bill of complaint in the county court of Cecil alleging said deed to be fraudulent; and provided also that distribution shall not be made to any creditor under this law, unless his claim be first exhibited to the orphans court of Cecil county, authenticated by the voucher, as is required by law in proving claims against deceased persons’ estates, and be likewise passed and allowed by said court.”

Which amendment was read and assented to. The bill thus amended was passed.

The senate adjourned until to-morrow morning 10 o’clock.

Friday, February 29, 1828

The Senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The resolution for the transmission of an authenticated copy of the act relative to the inspection of tobacco to each of the tobacco inspectors of this state; and the bill to authorise and empower Frisby Henderson, James Sewell and Enoch Cloud of Cecil county to sell and convey the property therein mentioned, were returned to the house of delegates.

The engrossed bills from number 58 to number 73 inclusive, and from number 92 to number 93 inclusive, were read assented to, and sent to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates returned said bills endorsed, ‘read and assented to.’

On motion of Mr. Herbert, the president named Mr. Sewell to supply the vacancy in the committee on internal improvement occasioned by the absence of Mr. Nelson.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a resolution providing for the binding of certain books in the same library, which was read the first time.
