

2d. In the 4th line of the 4th section, after the word 'creeks' insert the word 'ditches.'

3d. In the 4th line of the 5th section, after the word 'bridges' insert the word 'ditches.'

4th. In the 6th line of the same section, after the word 'causeway' insert the words 'agreeably to the provisions of this act.'

5th. In the last line of the same section after the word 'except' insert the word 'committed.'

6th. In the 6th line of the 6th section, after the word 'creeks' insert the word 'ditches.'

7th. In the 12th and 13th lines of the same section, strike out the words 'or any of them.'

8th. In the 15th line of the same section, after the word 'overseer' insert the words 'and a memorandum of the same, signed by the supervisor shall be delivered at the time to the owner, tenant or overseer.'

9th. In the 17th line of the 7th section strike out the word 'or' and insert 'and.'

10th. In the 12th line of the 9th section strike out the words 'one dollar' and insert in lieu thereof "fifty cents."

11th. In the 19th line of the same section, strike out the words 'one dollar' and insert the words 'fifty cents.'

12th. In the 8th line of the 14th section, strike out the words 'or in such other manner as they shall think most expedient.'

13th. In the 9th line of the same section, strike out the words, 'without the consent of the said proprietors.'

Mr. Whiteley from the committee made a favourable report upon the bill for the benefit of Maria Seth, of Queen Ann's county. The said bill was then read a second time.

Mr. Dennis from the committee to whom was referred the bill to make good and valid a certain deed of mortgage therein mentioned, reported the same with the following amendment, to wit: In the line before the last strike out 'twenty-first day of June.' and insert 'the twelfth day of October.' Which amendment was read and assented to. The said bill was then read a second and third time by special order, passed with the proposed amendment, and returned to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered the engrossed bills from number 1 to number 57 inclusive, and from number 74 to number 91 inclusive, which were read assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.
