

- 10th. Every bill or resolution brought in by a member, or received from the House of Delegates, shall be read on three several days, with an intermission of one day at least between each reading; during which time it shall lie for the perusal of the members, unless it be read by special order; and no bill, or matter of importance, shall have a third reading, until all the members in town be called upon to attend, if required by any member.
- 11th. No bill or resolution shall be read a third time by special order, without the concurrence of two-thirds of the members present.
- 12th. Every bill or resolution received from the House of Delegates, shall be committed to a special committee, if required by any member.
- 13th. All questions shall be determined by a majority of the attending members, except such as are otherwise provided for by the rules of the Senate.
- 14th. Every question shall be entered on the journal, and the votes taken by yeas and nays, if required by any member.
- 15th. The name of every member shall appear on the journal on motion for leave to bring in a bill; on motion proposing a resolution; and on motion to amend a bill, resolution, or order, on which the yeas and nays shall be called.
- 16th. The President may vote on any question, except an appeal from the chair, on a question of order; he may from time to time call any member to the chair, and when on the floor he shall have the privilege of entering into debate.
- 17th. All committees of the Senate or conferrees shall, if required by any member, be elected by ballot; the number not to exceed five.
- 18th. No member shall absent himself from the seat of government, without leave of the Senate.
- 19th. No rule shall be dispensed with, without the concurrence of two-thirds of the members present.
- 20th. When a question is under debate, no motion shall be received, unless to amend, to commit, for the previous question, to postpone it to a day certain, or adjourn.
- 21st. A motion to adjourn shall always be in order, and shall always be decided without debate.
- 22d. Any member may call for a division of a question, when the sense will admit of it.
