The Senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday.

The proceedings of yesterday were read. The President laid before the Senate a report from George Mackubbin Esq. Treasurer of the western shore made in obedience to the 3d section of the act of December session 1824, chapter 148; which was read and referred to the consideration of the house of delegates.

On motion of Mr. Smith, it was

Ordered, That the committee on engrossed bills be directed to compare the printed with the manuscript copy of the act, entitled, "An act to provide for the support of schools in Queen-Anne's county, and to withdraw the funds from the Centreville Academy, December session 1829, ch. 171: and if any error in the said printed copy be ascertained, to report such remedy as may be expedient.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a bill, entitled A supplement to the act, entitled, An act to allow Adam Robb, executor of Upton Beall, late clerk of Montgomery county court, further time to complete certain records, passed at December session 1828, chapter 2; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Forrest, Heath and Harrison.

Also a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of certain minors therein mentioned; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Heath, Smith and Spence.
