

The journals to be furnished for the use of the Executive and Legislature, within twelve hours from the delivery of the MSS. the other work to be executed without delay, with the power reserved of annulling the contract in case of failure; the laws to be paged, and with the journals to be completed and deposited in the council chamber, in thirty days from the delivery of the copy, the same number of copies to be bound in leather, to have as much matter on each page, and the execution in all respects to be as complete, in as good style, and the paper to be as good as of the last session.

The committee also recommends the adoption of the following resolution.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That on the delivery of the laws and journals in the council chamber, the Governor and Council are hereby authorised and empowered to settle the account of Jonas Green according to the terms of the contract entered into with him for the printing of the present session.
