Mr. Thomas, from the committee on ways and means, made a favourable report upon the resolution relative to the government house.

The said resolution was then read a second, and by spe-

cial order, a third time, and assented to.

Mr. Thomas, from the same committee, made a favourable report upon the resolution authorising the executive to settle the account of Jonas Green, for the printing of the present session.

The said resolution was then read a second, and by special order a third time, and assented to.

The senate adjourned until to-morrow morning 10 o'clock.

WEDNESDAY, January 12th, 1831.

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. Mr. Sewell appeared in the senate. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The resolution authorising the executive to settle the account of Jonas Green for the printing of the present session. The resolution relative to the government house resolution directing the treasurer of the western shore to invest the money due Montgomery county, on account of the tree schools fund, in the Commercial and Farmers Bank of Baltimore, severally assented to by the senate yesterday, were returned to the house of delegates. The communications received from George Howard and Thomas C. Worthington, Esquires, accepting their appointment as members of the executive council. And the message adopted by the senate yesterday, in answer to the message from the house of delegates, to inquire into the expediency and practicability of opening a safe and direct navigation through the sounds which run parallel with the sea-coast, and such cahals as may be necessary, between the Chesapeake and Delaware bays, were sent to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a bill, entitled, An additional supplement to an act, entitled, A supplement to an act to incorporate the Port Deposit and Chesapeake Turnpike road company, passed at December session 1827, chapter 200; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Kennedy, Thomas and Sewell.

Also a bill, entitled, An act to alter the name of Caleb Smith, of Dorchester county; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Harrison, Rees and Whiteley.
