And returned the bill, entitled, An act to change the name of James Stephen Thompson to Henry Saint James Linden, endorsed "will pass." Ordered that the said bill be engrossed.

Mr. Harrison from the committee on invalid deeds made an unfavourable report upon the bill, entitled, An act authorising the recording of a deed from Edward G. Williams, late of Washington county, deceased, to Sarah Syester.

The said bill was then read a second, and by special order a third time, and rejected.

Mr. Harrison from the same committee made an unfavourable report upon the bill, entitled, An act to authorise the clerk of Dorchester county court, to record a deed therein mentioned.

The said bill was then read a second, and by special order a third time, and rejected.

Mr. Harrison from the same committee made an unfavourable report upon the bill, entitled, An act authorising the clerk of Frederick county, to record a deed executed by Peter Frick, of the city and county of Baltimore, conveying certain lands therein mentioned, to Peter H. Brown of Frederick county.

The said bill was then read a second time, and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Harrison from the same same committee made a favourable report upon the bill, entitled, An act to make valid a certain deed of manumission therein mentioned.

The said bill was then read a second time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Forrest asked and obtained leave to bring in a bill to be entitled, An additional supplement to the act to prevent the unnecessary accumulation of costs in civil suits.

Ordered, That Messrs. Forrest, Spence and Smith, be a committee to prepare and report the same.

The senate adjourned until Monday morning ten o'clock.
