

And resolutions relating to the improvement of the navigation of the sounds parallel with the Atlantic coast; which was read the first time and referred to the committee on internal improvement.

And returned the resolutions relative to removing the obstructions to the entrance of the harbour of Annapolis, endorsed "assented to." Ordered that the said resolutions be engrossed.

Mr. Heath from the committee on internal improvement, made a favourable report upon the resolutions relating to the improvement of the navigation of the sounds parallel with the Atlantic coast.

The said resolutions were then read a second and by special order a third time, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

On motion of Mr. Forrest, the senate took up the consideration of the bill, entitled, An additional supplement to the act to prevent the unnecessary accumulation of costs in civil suits

Mr. Kennedy moved that the bill be laid on the table, and the question was put, and determined in the affirmative.

On motion of Mr. Forrest, the said bill was then made the order of the day for to-morrow.

Mr. Kennedy from the committee reported a bill, entitled, An act relative to the public buildings at Annapolis; which was read the first time and ordered to be printed.

Mr. Heath from the committee reported a bill, entitled, An act to authorise John D. Daniels, of the city of Baltimore, to lease certain property therein mentioned; which was read the first time.

The senate adjourned until to-morrow morning ten o'clock.

FRIDAY, January 21, 1831.

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

Mr. Heath asked and obtained leave to bring in a bill to be entitled, A further supplement to the act, entitled, An act concerning crimes and punishments. Ordered, That Messrs. Heath, Spence and Harrison, be a committee to prepare and report the same.
