Michael's, and to appoint commissioners, was read the third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

On motion of Mr. Rees, the bill, entitled, An act to fix the compensation of jurors in Kent county, was read the second time by special order, and ordered to be engressed for a third reading.

The president laid before the senate a communication from the president of the Washington and Baltimore turnpikeroad company, enclosing an abstract of the accounts of the said company in conformity to the directions of the act of assembly passed at November session 1812, entitled, An act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from the District of Columbia to the city of Baltimore; which was read and referred to the consideration of the house of delegates.

On motion of Mr. Heath, the bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act to incorporate the Powhatan manufacturing company of Maryland, was read the second time by special order, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

On motion of Mr. Heath, the bill, entitled, An act to authorise John D. Daniels, of the city of Baltimore, to lease certain property therein mentioned, was read the second time by special order, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

On motion of Mr. Smith, the bill, entitled, A further and an additional supplement to an act, entitled, An act concerning crimes and punishments, was read the third time by special order, passed as amended, and returned to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a bill, entitled, An act to abolish the levy court, and provide for the election by the people, of commissioners for Talbot county, and prescribing their powers and duties; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Harrison, Rees and Whiteley.

Also a bill, entitled, An act to provide for the fuller administration of justice in equity cases, in Allegany county; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Heath, Kennedy and Herbert.

Also a bill, entitled, An additional supplement to the act, entitled, An act authorising the appointing inspectors and corders of fire wood brought by water to the city of Baltimore for sale; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Heath, Smith and Spence.
