

from the city of Frederick to Harper's Ferry, passed at December session 1828, chapter 142, reported the same with the following amendment, viz.

Amendment proposed: In the 2d line of the 2d section strike out the word "thirty" and insert in lieu thereof the word "forty;" which amendment was read and assented to.

The said bill was then read a second time.

Mr. Spence from the committee made an unfavourable report upon the bill, entitled, An act to abolish all such parts of the constitution and form of government as relates to the time and manner of electing the senate, and the mode of filling up vacancies in that body, so that each county and the city of Baltimore may have a senator to be elected immediately by the people.

The said bill was then read a second time, and on motion of Mr. Smith, was ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Heath from the committee, reported a bill, entitled, An act to confirm an act, entitled, An act to regulate the removal of proceeding in criminal cases, and to make certain changes in the constitution and form of government for that purpose; which was read the first time.

Mr. Spence from the committee to whom was recommit-
ted the bill, entitled, An act to exempt the wearing apparel of deceased persons from appraisement and sale in certain cases, and for other purposes, reported the same with the following amendments, viz.

Amendments proposed.

1st. In the 4th line of the 1st section, after the word "there," strike out the words "legal representatives," and insert the words "shall be a widow, or child or children, or grand child or grand children."

2d. In the 6th line of the same section, after the word "of," strike out the remainder of the section, and insert "the child or children of the deceased; and if there be no child or children, then the same shall belong to and be the property of the grand-child or grand-children of the deceased; and if there be neither child nor grand-child, then the same shall belong to and be the property of the widow of the deceased.

3d. Between the 2d and 3d sections add the following section: "And be it enacted, That in all cases in which the wearing apparel of a deceased person is exempted from appraisement and sale by virtue of the provisions of this act,
