

On motion of Mr Kennedy, the committee on the said bill was enlarged by the addition of Messrs. Heath and Spence.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act to incorporate the Jackson Beneficial Society of the city of Baltimore, passed at December session 1819; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Heath, Smith and Forrest.

Also a bill, entitled, An act to abolish imprisonment for debt in the state of Maryland; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Heath, Harrison and Spence.

Also a bill, entitled, An act to abolish the office of commissioners of the tax for Charles county; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Thomas, Smith and Forrest.

Also a bill, entitled, An act to extend real estate; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Forrest, Heath and Harrison.

Also a bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of George Gardner and William Mudd, of Charles county; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Thomas, Harrison and Whiteley.

Also a bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of James B. Dixon, former sheriff of Calvert county; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Forrest, Rees and Herbert.

Also a bill, entitled, An act for the revaluation of the real and personal property in Saint-Mary's county, and for other purposes; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Thomas, Sewell and Whiteley.

Also a bill, entitled, An act supplementary to the act, entitled, An act to regulate the issuing of licenses to traders, keepers of ordinaries, and others, passed at December session 1827; which was read the first time and referred to the committee on ways and means.

And returned the bill, entitled, An act to authorise John Daniels, of the city of Baltimore, to lease certain property therein mentioned, endorsed "will pass." Ordered, that the said bill be engrossed.

On motion of Mr. Heath, the bill, entitled, An act to extend the jurisdiction of justices of the peace, was read the third time by special order, rejected, and returned to the house of delegates.
