On motion of Mr. Heath, The bill, entitled, An act relating to certain books and records in the orphans court of Baltimore county, was recommitted.

Mr. Smith asked and obtained leave to bring in a bill, to be entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act to prevent obstructions in Smith's and other private docks in the city of Baltimore. Ordered, That Messrs. Smith, Heath and Sewell, be a committee to prepare and report the same.

Mr. Forrest asked and obtained leave to bring in a bill, to be entitled, An act relating to the court of chancery. Ordered, That Messrs. Forrest, Heath and Harrison, be a committee to prepare and report the same.

Mr. Herbert from the committee, made favourable report upon the resolution directing the clerk of the council to advertise that proposals will be received for furnishing stationery for the executive and legislature.

The said resolution was then read a second time.

Mr. Forrest from the committee reported a bill, entitled, An act relating to the court of chancery; which was read the first time.

Mr. Harrison from the committee made a favourable report upon the bill, entitled, An act relating to coroners holding inquests.

The said bill was then read a second time.

Mr. Sewell from the committee made a favourable report upon the bill, entitled, An act to alter the location of the election districts in Harford county therein mentioned.

The said bill was then read a second, and by special order a third time, and passed.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act to regulate the inspection of tobacco, so far as relates to Prince-George's county; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Herbert, Forrest and Kennedy.

Also a bill, entitled, An act for the fuller administration of justice in equity cases in Allegany county; which was read
