Rees, Sewell and Whiteley.

Also a bill, entitled. A supplement to the act, entitled, An act empowering and directing the commissioners of Cecil county to build two fire proof offices, for the use of the clerks of the county and register of wills, for the safe keeping of the records appertaining to their respective offices, in the town of Elkton; which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs.
