The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday, except Mr. Spence.

The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill, entitled, An act to alter the location of the election districts in Harford county, passed by the senate yesterday, was returned to the house of delegates.

On motion of Mr. Heath, the engrossed bill, entitled, An act relating to certain books and records in the orphans court of Baltimore county, was read the third time by special order, passed, and sent to the house of delegates.

Mr. Dennis appeared in the senate and took his seat.

On motion of Mr. Heath the bill, entitled, An act to widen Gay-street, formerly Bridge-street, in the city of Baltimore, was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a bill, entitled, An act to divorce Mary North, and her husband John North, of Dorchester county; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Rees, Forrest and Heath.

Also a bill, entitled, An act to abolish the levy court and sommissioners of the tax for Calvert county, and for other purposes; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Herbert, Dennis and Forrest.

Also a bill, entitled, An act to provide for the consolidation and distribution of the several school funds; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Heath, Harrison, and Whiteley.

Also a bill, entitle I, An act altering and changing the name of Stephen Adams to Stephen Henning Adams; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Kennedy, Forrest and Herbert.

A resolution in favour of John J. Jacob, a revolutionary officer; which was read the first time and referred to the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims.

Also a resolution authorising the treasurer of the western shore to pay to Henry Harding, for the use of Mary Wheelan, the balance of the pension due Joseph Clemly; which was read the first timeand referred to the same committee.

And returned the bill, entitled, An act to incorporate the Warren Manufacturing Company.
