On motion of Mr. Kennedy, the bill, entitled, An act to prevent bullet-playing in and near to Middle-Town, in Frederick county, was read the third time by special order, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

On motion of Mr. Kennedy, the bill, entitled, An act to repeal all such parts of the constitution and form of government, as relates to the division of Frederick county into eleven election districts, and for other purposes, was read the third time by special order, passed as amended, and returned to the house of delegates.

On motion of Mr. Kennedy, the bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act for the dispatch of business in Frederick county court, passed at December session 1829, chapter 107, was taken up for consideration, being on its third reading,

Mr. Forrest, moved to amend the bill by adding to the end of it the following additional section, viz. "And be it enacted, that upon a petition for a road being filed with the clerk of Frederick county court, any judge of said court may appoint commissioners, and the clerk of said court shall issue a commission as now prescribed by law in road cases, during the recess of the court; which amendment was read and assented to.

On motion of Mr. Harrison, the said bill was then ordered to lie on the table.

On motion of Mr. Heath, the bill, entitled, A further supplement to the act, entitled, An act concerning crimes and punishments, was recommitted.

Mr. Kennedy, from the committee reported a bill, entitled, An act to abolish imprisonment for debt on any judgment rendered by a justice of the peace; which was read the first time and ordered to be printed.

Mr. Sewell, from the committee to whom was referred the bill, entitled, An act supplementary to the act, entitled, An act to appoint commissioners to establish the boundary line between Hartord and Cecil counties, reported the same with the following amendment, viz.

Amendment proposed.

At the end of the 1st section add the following words:

"And the said clerks shall be paid by the parties interested
in said deeds at the same rate and in the same manner as is
now directed by law for recording of deeds."

Which amendment was read and assented to.

The said bill was then read a second time.
