bill, entitled, An act to authorise commissioners to divide Prince George's county into school districts; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Herbert, Kennedy and Forrest.

Also a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Bolton Jackson, of the city of Baltimore; which was read the first time,

and referred to Messrs, Harrison, Rees and Sewell.

Also a bill, estitled, An act for the revaluation of the read and personal property in Montgomery county; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Forrest, Herbert and Harrison.

A resolution directing the clerks of the senate and house of delegates to deliver to the state librarian the manuscript votes and proceedings of the several legislatures of the province and state of Maryland, in the committee rooms; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Forrest, Kennedy and Whiteley.

And a resolution directing the clerk of the council to transmit to the legislature annually a statement of the disbursements and expenditures of the executive department for the previous current year; which was read the first time and re-

ferred to the committee on ways and means.

Mr. Kennedy. from the committee made a favourable report upon the bill, entitled, An act altering and changing the name of Stephen Adams to Stephen Henning Adams.

The said bill was then read a second time.

Mr. Herbert, from the committee made a favourable report upon the bill, entitled, An act to abolish the levy court and commissioners of the tax for Calvert county, and for other purposes.

The said bill was then read a second, and by special order a third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

On motion of Mr. Herbert, the bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled. An act to regulate the inspection of tobacco, so far as relates to Prince-George's county, with the amendment reported by the committee, was recommitted.

The bill relating to coroners holding inquests being entitled to a third reading, was on motion ordered to lie on the

table.

The bill, entitled, An act supplementary to the act, entitled, An act to appoint commissioners to establish the boundary line between Harford and Cecil counties, was read the third time, passed as amended, and returned to the house of delegates.

On motion of Mr. Dennis, the committee on ways and means was discharged from the further consideration of the petition of Martin Bourke, of Washington county, and it was referred to the consideration of the house of delegates.

The bill, entitled, An act relating to the court of chancery, was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.
