

WEDNESDAY, February 2d, 1831.

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday.

The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act to regulate the inspection of tobacco so far as relates to Prince-George's county, passed by the senate yesterday, was returned to the house of delegates.

The bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of Milo Mason, of the army of the United States, passed by the senate on the same day, was sent to the house of delegates.

The bill, entitled, An act altering and changing the name of Stephen Adams; to Stephen Henning Adams, was read the third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

The bill, entitled, An act to divorce Mary North, and her husband John North, of Dorchester county, was read the third time, by special order, rejected, and returned to the house of delegates.

The engrossed bill, entitled, An act relating to the court of chancery, being entitled to a third reading; was

On motion of Mr. Heath, Ordered to lie on the table.

On motion of Mr. Harrison the bill, entitled, An act to abolish the levy court, and provide for the election by the people, of commissioners for Talbot county, and prescribing their powers and duties; was read the third time, by special order, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Forrest, from the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims, made a favourable report upon the resolution in favour of Elizabeth J. Waters, widow of Richard Waters, who was a captain in the revolutionary war.

The said resolution, was then read a second, and by special order, a third time, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Forrest, from the committee made a favourable report upon the bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of James B. Dixon, former sheriff of Calvert county.

The said bill, was then read a second time.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a bill, entitled, An act to incorporate The American Institute at Mount St. Mary's; which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Kennedy, Heath and Forrest.

Also a bill, entitled, A further additional supplement to the act, entitled, An act to establish pilots and regulate their fees; which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs] Heath, Dennis and Thomas.

And a preamble and resolution relative to the Cumberland road; which was read the first time, and referred to the committee on internal improvement.
