their appearance in any suit or action in the courts of this

state, without special authority.

We dissent from the third amendment, and with an amendment by us proposing to insert the words "plaintiff or plaintiffs" to come in before the word "defendant" whereever it occurs, we assent all the other amendments proposed. The object of our amendments to those proposed by your honourable body, is to make the bill in its operation apply as well to plaintiffs as defendants, the necessity of which we trust will appear obvious when the fact is adverted to. that by the practice of the courts under existing laws, any attorney may enter his appearance for the plaintiff to any suit or action, and thereby be legally competent to release the defendant, receive the plaintiffs money and make any use of it he may think proper without the authority, knowledge or consent of such plaintiff, whereby injury and loss may sometimes happen to those who may be under the necessity of collecting their debts through the medium of the courts of this state.

With these very brief suggestions, we return the bill and amendments as amended in this house to your honourable body, and respectfully request that you will reconsider and

assent thereto. .
