Determined in the affirmative. So the message was adopted, and sent to the House of Delegates.

On motion of Mr. Heath, the bill, entitled, An act to extend real estate, was read the third time, rejected, and returned to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Rees, from the committee, made an unfavorable report upon the bill entitled, An act to alter the name of Harriett Clarke of Dorchester county.

The said bill was then read a second time, and on motion of Mr. Kennedy, was ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Rees, from the committee, made a favorable report upon the bill, entitled, An act to authorise the commissioners of Cecil county, to build a bridge and open a road in said county.

The said bill was then read a second time.

Mr. Forrest, from the committee, to whom was referred the bill entitled, An act for the relief of William Clare, late collector of the tax for Calvert county, reported the same with the following amendments, viz. amendments proposed.

1st in 4th line of 1st section after the word "tax," strike out the words "due from any person or persons as."

2d in 6th line of 1st section after the word "two" insert "and now due upon any lands which may have been sold by him for the purpose of making said tax, where the sale may not have been ratified or consummated."

3d after the word "years" in the 8th line of the 1st section, strike out the remainder of the bill.

Which amendments were read and assented to.

The said bill was then read a second time.
