Determined in the negative. So the Senate refused to order the memorial to be printed.

The clerk of the House of Delegates delivered a bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act to provide for electing commissioners for Washington county, and prescribing their powers and duties; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Kennedy, Sewell and Whiteley.

Also a bill, entitled, An act to authorise the Baltimore and Susquehannah Rail Road Company to construct a lateral Rail Road to Westminster, and for other purposes, which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Internal Improvement.

Also a bill entitled, An act incorporate the Fredericktown Savings Institution; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Kennedy, Forrest and Smith.

Also, a bill, entitled, A further supplement to an act for the distribution of a certain fund for the purpose of establishing Free Schools in the several counties therein mentioned; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Dennis, Harrison and Rees.

Also, a bill, entitled, An act authorising the commissioners of the town of Havre de Grace, in Harford county, to build a wharf in the river Susquehanna, at the termination of St. Clair street, otherwise known by the name of Brown's Point, in said town; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Sewell, Smith and Thomas;
