Mr. Heath offered the following message; which was read, assented to, and sent to the House of Delegates.

The Senate has received your message, and for the reasons assigned by your honorable body accedes to the proposition to extend the session.

Mr. Heath from the committee, reported a bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act for the despatch of business in Baltimore county Court; which was read the first time and ordered to be printed.

Mr. Heath from the committee, also reported a bill entitled, a further supplement to the act passed at November session one thousand seven hundred and ninety five, entitled, an act to establish a Bank and incorporate the subscribers thereto, which was read the first time and ordered to be printed.

Mr. Kennedy from the committee, made a favourable report upon the bill, entitled, an act for the relief of John Barks, of Washington county, and Mary Barks of Frederick county, the said bill was then read a second time.

The Senate, in pursuance of the order adopted this morning, proceeded to the election of a Bank Director on the part of the State, in the Bank of Baltimore.

Mr. Heath nominated William Dickinson Esq. the ballot box being prepared, the ballots were deposited therein, and on examination thereof by the clerk, it appeared that William Dickinson Esquire, had ten votes, and that there were two blanks.

Whereupon it was declared in the Senate, that William Dickinson, Esq. was duly elected a Director on the part of the State in the Bank of Baltimore, for and during the present year.

Mr. Heath presented the petition of George G. Presbury, praying the passage of a law to authorise the Commissioners of Baltimore county to assess and levy a sum of money for the purposes therein mentioned; which was read and referred to Messrs. Heath, Smith and Forrest

On motion of Mr. Harrison, the bill, entitled, an act to authorise the recording of the will of Christian Wyandt, late of Washington county, was read the third time and passed.

The clerk of the House of Delegates delivered a bill, entitled, a supplement to the act for the better regulation of Apprentices; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Heath, Smith and Dennis.
