Which amendment was read the first time. When, on motion of Mr. Heath, the said bill, with the proposed amendment, was ordered to lie on the table

The Senate adjourned until to-morrow morning ten o'clock.

FRIDAY, February 4th, 1831.

The Senate met. Present the same members as on yester.

The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill, entitled, an act to authorise the recording of the will of Christian Wyandt, late of Washington county, and the bill entitled, a further supplement to the act, entitled, an act for the distribution of a certain fund for the purpose of establishing free schools in the several counties therein mentioned, severally passed by the Senate yesterday, were returned to the House

of Delegates. The President laid before the Senate a communication from the President of the Baltimore and Harford Turnpike company, enclosing an abstract of the accounts of said company in the prosecution of their work in conformity to the directions of the act for making certain roads in Baltimore and Harford counties; also a communication from the President of the Baltimore and Havre-de-Grace Turnpike company, enclosing an abstract of the accounts of said company in the prosecution of their work, in conformity to the directions of the act to incorporate a company to make a Turnqike Road from the city of Baltimore to Havre-de-Grace; which were severally read and referred to the consideration of the House of Delegates.

Mr. Heath presented a letter from William League State Wharfinger in the city of Baltimore, in relation to certain obstructions opposite the State's property in said city; which was

read and referred to Messrs. Heath, Smith and Thomas.

The bill entitled, an act to divorce Elizabeth Rawleigh, from her husband Greenbury I. Rawleigh, of Dorchester county; was read the third time, rejected, and returned to the House of Delegates.

The bill, entitled, an act to provide for the consolidation and distribution of the several school funds, being entitled to a third reading, was on motion, ordered to lie on the table.

The bill, entitled, an act to provide for the prompt payment of witnesses in criminal cases being entitled to a third reading,

was on motion ordered to lie on the table. The bill, entitled, an act for the benefit of of James B. Dixon, tormer Sheriff of Calvert county, being entitled to a third reading, was on motion of Mr. Thomas ordered to lie on the table.
