

An act empowering and directing the commissioners of Cecil county, to build two fire-proof offices for the use of the clerks of the county and register of wills, for the safe keeping of the records appertaining to their respective offices, in the town of Elkton.

The said bill was then read a second, and by special order a third time, and passed.

Mr. Rees from the committee, made a favourable report upon the bill, entitled, An act relating to the records in the register of wills office in Kent county.

The said bill was then read the second time.

Mr. Kennedy from the committee to whom was referred the bill, entitled, An act to provide for the opening of a street in Hager's-Town, reported the same with the following amendments, viz.

#### Amendments proposed.

In the 8th line of the 3d section, after the word "himself," insert the words "or herself."

Add to the end of the bill the following additional section: "Sec. 5. And be it enacted, That if in the future improvement of Antietam-street the aforesaid bridge should be found an obstruction to such improvement, it shall be the duty of the moderator and commissioners of Hager's-Town, and they are hereby expressly authorised and required, to cause such bridge to be removed, or so constructed as to admit the free passage of wagons, or other vehicles, up and down said street."

Which amendments were read and assented to.

The said bill was then read a second, and by special order a third time, and passed with the proposed amendments.

On motion by Mr. Kennedy, the bill to alter the name of Harriet Clarke, of Dorchester county, was recommitted.

Mr. Sewell from the committee, made a favourable report upon the bill, entitled, An act to continue in force the acts of assembly which would expire with the present session.

The said bill was then read a second, and by special order a third time, and passed.

Mr. Kennedy asked and obtained leave to bring in a bill to be entitled, An act to confirm an act passed at December session 1829, chapter 168. Ordered, That Messrs. Kennedy, Harrison and Sewell, be a committee to prepare and report the same.
