

over Deer creek, at or near William Pyles' saw-mill, with the following amendment, viz.

Amendment proposed.

After the word "empowered," in the third line of the bill, insert the following words, "at their discretion."

Which amendment was read and assented to.

The said bill was then read a second, and by special order a third time, passed with the proposed amendment, and returned to the house of delegates.

On motion of Mr. Heath, the message offered by him on the 8th inst. relative to the rejection by the house of delegates, of the bill, entitled, An act to confirm an act, entitled, An act to regulate the removal of proceedings in criminal cases, and to make certain changes in the constitution and form of government for that purpose, was read the second time, assented to, and sent to the house of delegates with the bill to which it relates.

On motion of Mr. Smith, the senate proceeded to a second reading of the bill, entitled, An act to incorporate the Baltimore Life Insurance Company.

Mr. Heath moved to amend the bill by inserting after the word "endowments," in the 2d line of the 4th section, the following words, "of personal or mixed property, for a term of years in trust."

Which amendment was read and assented to.

The said bill having been read throughout, and amended, was then ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a bill, entitled, An act to extend the time of taking appeals from the chancery court in a certain case therein mentioned; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Forrest, Heath and Thomas.

Also a bill, entitled, An act regulating the manner of levying on the assessable property in Anne-Arundel county, for the support of primary schools in said county; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Herbert, Heath and Forrest.

Also a bill, entitled, An act to repeal the fifth section of an act, entitled, An act to regulate the manner of granting out county pensions for Anne-Arundel county, passed at December session 1829, chapter 63; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Herbert, Harrison and Smith.

And a resolution extending the time for completing the records in the office of register of wills of Charles county;
