

Senate. And the resolution authorising the Governor to subscribe on behalf of the state for fifty copies of an edition of Harris's Entries, proposed to be published by Lucas and Deaver; assented to by the Senate, were returned to the House of Delegates; the bill, entitled, An act to confirm an act passed at December session, 1829, chapter 168; the bill, entitled, An act to authorise the recording of a deed therein mentioned; the bill, entitled, a supplement to an act to enlarge the bounds of Centreville, and for other purposes; and the bill, entitled, An act to incorporate the Baltimore Life Insurance Company, severally passed by the Senate. And the message, relative to inviting the Governor in the Senate chamber to sign and seal the engrossed bills, were sent to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Kennedy, from the committee, to whom was re-committed the bill, entitled, An act for the relief of John Barks of Washington county, and Mary Barks of Frederick county, reported the same, with the following amendment, viz: [Amendment proposed.] Strike out the whole of the bill after the enacting clause and insert—"That the marriage contract heretofore entered into between John Barks, and Mary his wife, be and the same is henceforth and for ever dissolved, to all intents and purposes as if the same had never been solemnized."

Which amendment was read, and the question put, "Will the Senate assent to the amendment? Determined in the negative—so the amendment was rejected.

On motion of Mr. Kennedy, the said bill was then ordered to lie on the table.

On motion of Mr. Heath, the bill, entitled, An act to divorce Richard Gittings, and Elizabeth Gittings of Baltimore county, was taken up for consideration, read a second time, and after some discussion, the question was put, shall the bill be engrossed for a third reading? Determined in the affirmative—so the bill was ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The clerk of the House of Delegates delivered a bill, entitled, An act to divorce Charity Alderson and William C. Alderson, which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Kennedy, Harrison and Dennis.

Also a bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act to incorporate the trustees of the Maria Marthian society of Baltimore, passed at December session, 1828, chapter
