The said bill was then read a second time.

Mr. Forrest, from the committee, made a favorable report upon the bill entitled, a supplement to an act to provide for the purchase of the office papers formerly belonging to the Surveyor’s Office of Montgomery county, passed at December session 1829, chapter 126.

The said bill was then read a second, and by special order a third time, passed, and returned to the House of Delegates.

Mr Heath offered the following message; which was read, assented to, and sent to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Forrest and Mr. Heath, from the joint committee appointed on the part of the Senate to wait on his Excellency the Governor, and invite him into the Senate Chamber this evening at 7 o’clock, to sign and seal the engrossed bills that might be prepared for that purpose, reported, that they had performed that duty, and that his Excellency would attend accordingly.

On motion of Mr. Heath, the report of the committee relative to the bill for the benefit of the University of Maryland, was read a second time and concurred in.

The bill, entitled, an additional supplement to the act, entitled, an act for the benefit of the University of Maryland, was then read a second, and by special order a third time, and rejected.

On motion the Senate then adjourned until this evening 7 o’clock.

The engrossed bills from No. 65 to No. 74, inclusive, were severally read, assented to, and sent to the House of Delegates.
