

And delivered the engrossed bills of the House of Delegates, from No. 1 to No. 64; which were severally read, assented to, and returned to the House of Delegates.

His Excellency the Governor having appeared in the Senate Chamber.

On motion of Mr. Forrest it was,

Ordered, That Messrs. Forrest and Heath wait on the Speaker and members of the House of Delegates, and inform them that his Excellency the Governor is attending in the Senate Chamber, ready to sign and seal the engrossed bills, and invite their attendance for the purpose of witnessing the same.

Whereupon the Speaker, attended by the members of the House of Delegates, appeared in the Senate Chamber when the engrossed bills from No. 1 to No. 74, inclusive, were presented by the Speaker of the House of Delegates to his Excellency the Governor, who signed and affixed the great seal of the state to the same, in the presence of both houses, according to the provisions of the constitution and form of government.

The honourable the Speaker, and the members of the House of Delegates, then retired from the Senate Chamber—when, The Senate adjourned until Monday morning 10 o'clock.

#### MONDAY, February 4<sup>th</sup>, 1831.

The senate met. Present the same members as on Saturday, except Mr. Herbert.

The proceedings of Saturday were read.

The bill, entitled, An additional supplement to the act, entitled, An act for the benefit of the University of Maryland, rejected by the senate on Saturday, was returned to the house of delegates.

The bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of Horatio Clagett of Alexandria, was read the third time, passed as amended, and returned to the house of delegates.

The engrossed bill, entitled, An act to divorce Richard Gittings and Elizabeth Gittings, of Baltimore county, was read a third time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates.

The bill, entitled, An act to authorise the orphans' courts of this state to apportion the expenses incurred in improving real estates in cases of dower in said estates, was read a third time, passed as amended, and returned to the house of delegates.

The bill, entitled, An act to repeal an act of assembly, entitled, An act to limit the time for taking appeals from magistrates judgments, passed at December session 1829, chapter 256, and for other purposes, being entitled to a third reading, was on motion ordered to lie on the table.
