

third time, passed with the proposed amendments, and returned to the House of Delegates.

On motion of Mr. Heath, the engrossed bill, entitled, A further supplement to the act passed at November session one thousand seven hundred and ninety five, entitled, An act to establish a Bank and incorporate the subscribers thereto, was read a third time, passed, and sent to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Thomas from the committee on ways and means made a favorable report upon the resolution directing the clerk of the Council, to transmit to the Legislature annually, a statement of the disbursements and expenditures of the Executive Department for the previous year.

The said resolutions was then read a second, and by special order a third time, assented to, and returned to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Thomas from the same committee made a favourable report upon the resolution respecting the printing of additional copies of the laws of the present session,—which was read the first, and by special order a second time; and on motion of Mr. Heath, was ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Thomas from the same committee, made a favourable report upon the resolution in favor of Bell and James, of Dorchester county, also upon the resolution authorising the treasurer of the Western Shore to pay to Benjamin L. Gantt, for the use of Benjamin Duvall, jun. of Prince George's county, a sum of money therein mentioned.

The said resolutions were then severally read a second, and by special order a third time, assented to, and returned to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Heath from the committee, made a favourable report upon the bill, entitled, an act to abolish imprisonment for debt in the state of Maryland, with the following amendments, viz. Amendments proposed—strike out the preamble to the bill, strike out the title of the bill, and insert the following as its title: "A further supplement to the act, entitled an act for the relief of sundry insolvent debtors."

Which amendments were read and assented to.

The said bill was then read a second time.

Mr. Heath from the committee to which was referred the bill, entitled, An act to authorise a subscription to the capital stock of the Baltimore and Susquehanna Rail Road company; reported, that the committee had had the same under consideration and a majority of the committee were of opinion the said bill ought to pass.

Mr. Whiteley from the committee made a favorable report upon the bill, entitled, An act to lay out and bound the limits of the village of Greensborough, in Caroline county.

The said bill was then read a second, and by special order a third time, passed, and returned to the House of Delegates.
