In compliance with your request, we return to you for the purpose of amendment, the bill, entitled, an act to authorise a subscription to the capital stock of the Baltimore and Susquehanna Rail Road company.

Add the following proviso to the first section of the bill: "provided that the said Commissioners shall not proceed to act unless, in the opinion of the county Commissioners of Anne-Arundel and Baltimore counties, the mutual interests and conveniences of said counties require the erection of said bridge."

In the 3d line of the 2d section, strike out the word "directed" and insert the word "empowered"

Which amendments were read and assented to.

The said bill was then read a second, and by special order a third time, passed with the proposed amendments, and returned to the House of Delegates.
