

a favorable report upon the resolution in favor of John Rigney, of Frederick county.

The said resolution was then read a second time, and on motion of Mr. Harrison was ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Thomas from the same committee made a favorable report upon the resolution relating to the county schools funds, also upon the resolution relating to the common Free school fund.

The said resolutions were then severally read a second, and by special order a third time, assented to, and returned to the House of Delegates.

The resolution directing the Governor and Council to appoint two planters from each of the six most extensive counties in the state, and two shippers of tobacco; to examine into the condition of the public warehouses, and the different scites on the basin, was read a third time, assented to, and returned to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Herbert from the committee to which was referred the bill, entitled, a supplement to the act, entitled, an act to build or repair the jail of Prince George's county, reported the same with the following amendments, viz.

Amendments proposed.

Add the following proviso to the end of the bill, "proposed that the said Levy court shall not be authorised to levy on the assessable property of said county, for the purpose aforesaid, a sum of money not exceeding eight hundred and thirty dollars in any one year," and

Add the following as an additional section, to be numbered 2.

*And be it enacted,* That the said Levy court shall be and they are hereby authorised and empowered, to borrow from time to time such sum or sums of money, not exceeding in the whole amount twenty five hundred dollars, in anticipation of the levies authorised by this act, and the act to which this is a supplement."

Which amendments were read and assented to,

The said bill was then read a second, and by special order a third time, passed with the proposed amendments and returned to the House of Delegates.

The clerk of the House of Delegates delivered a bill, entitled, an act to compensate the Adjutant General of this State; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Smith, Thomas and Herbert.

Also, a bill, entitled, a supplement to the act, passed at December session 1825, regulating the inspection of flour in the
