Also, the bill, entitled, an act to authorise the recording of a deed therein mentioned.

Also, the bill, entitled, an act to authorise Jonas McPherson, to lease certain property belonging to the minor children of William Alcock, deceased.

Also, the bill entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act concerning crimes and punishments; severally en-

dorsed "will pass."

Ordered that the said bills be engrossed.

Also, the bill, entitled, An act to confirm an act, entitled, An act to regulate the removal of proceedings in criminal cases, and to make certain changes in the constitution and form of government for that purpose; endorsed, "reconsidered and rejected."

A resolution relative te the free schools fund.

Also, a resolution in favor of Jonas Green.

Also, a resolution relative to Charles county Free School fund.

Also, a resolution in favor of the Rev. Mr. Borsey, chaplain of the House of Delegates, and the Rev. Mr. Blanchard, chaplain of the Senate; which were severally read the first time, and referred to the committee on ways and means.

Also, a resolution in favor of Stephen Hasley, a revolu-

ionary soldier.

Also, a resolution in favor of Maria Gambrill. Also, a resolution in favor of Gassaway Pindell.

Also, a resolution in favor of Elizabeth Dawkins, of Cal-

vert county, widow of a revolutionary soldier.

And a resolution in favor of Samuel Morton of Snint Marry's county, a revolutionary soldier; which were severally read the first time, and referred to the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims.

On motion of Mr Herbert, the bill, entitled, a supplement to an act, entitled, An act for regulating and inspecting weights and measures used in this state; passed at December session, 1825, chapter 206, was read a third time by special order, rejected, and returned to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Smith, from the committee, made an unfavorable report upon the bill, entitled, a supplement to the act, entitled, An act to incorporate the Franklin Turnpike Road company,

passed at December session, 1827, chapter 186.

The said bill was then read a second time, and by special order a third time, rejected, and returned to the House Delegates.

Mr. Heath, from the committee on internal improvement, made a favorable report upon the bill, entitled, A second sup-
